

Snap Benefits Reduced

Pierce County Neighbors Are In Need

Many of our neighbors in Pierce County are currently facing a hunger cliff after SNAP benefits (formerly food stamps) were reduced in March. Emergency allotments were made at the start of the pandemic to help families get by, but these additional allotments have now ended. Families will lose between \$95 and \$250 a month in benefits, which will be particularly difficult now as food prices are so high. SNAP benefits allow households to buy the foods that make the most sense for their family and serve as a multiplier in local economies



Economists at Moody's Analytics found that every \$1 of SNAP benefits generates \$1.67 in economic activity, helping families purchase food while creating jobs at farms and supermarkets as people buy more food. We anticipate that visits will increase greatly in March as families lose these additional benefits while the cost of groceries is still high.

Our neighbors need your help navigating this potential cliff. You can support EFN financially by making a one-time or monthly donation, hosting a food and fund drive that increases the diversity of products on food pantry shelves, or volunteering. Donate Food in Honor of Earth Day



With Earth Day coming up later this month, you might be thinking about ways to use resources more thoughtfully and sustainably. Here at EFN, we work every day to ensure that no food goes to waste and instead feeds neighbors in need. Reducing food waste doesn't just help the environment – it also helps our community!

According to Feeding America, 119 billion pounds of food is wasted each year in the United States. Food waste in our homes makes up 39% of that total, while commercial food waste makes up 61%. Food may go to waste for a variety of reasons, including blemishes, problems in manufacturing or transportation, or simply going uneaten and spoiling. Much of this food is still nutritious, and EFN partners with retailers, manufacturers, farmers, and trucking companies to rescue millions of pounds of food that might otherwise go to waste.

Spring is here! March 20th was the first day of Spring and the farm is rising from the ground in waves.

To keep warm, we've been busy seeding lettuce, cabbage, kale, fennel, kohlrabi, and so much more for our early April and May produce. Our hot crops are in full swing and are happy in their warm environment with heat mats below and grow lights above. To entice more pollinators to our farm, we've been prioritizing growing flowers and herbs for our front annual and perennial garden spaces. It has us dreaming of bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds buzzing about the summer and fall months.

As spring swings into full gear, the farm will be looking to host volunteers on Fridays and the second Saturday of each month. If you are looking to come to the farm and you are an individual or with a buddy or you and your friend want to come out, Friday is the day for you!
